DISASTER AID AT THE ROTARY INSTITUTE (Zones 7B & 8)

ur Rotary Club Project, **Disaster Aid Australia** was delighted to be invited to provide a **Keynote Speaker** for the combined **Rotary Zone Institute** for Zones 7B (*New Zealand*) and 8 (*Australia*) in early September in Penrith, NSW.



Disaster Aid International Chairman **David Langworthy** (a member and Past President of the **RC of Endeavour Hills**) addressed delegates in the session immediately following lunch on the second day of the Institute.

David's talk concentrated on the vital supply of safe water to communities affected by disasters, or just suffering from the effects of water-borne diseases.

David's theme was, '*A child without clean water is … a disaster*', and he outlined some of the water projects Disaster Aid had completed. He explained how the Australian-invented *SkyHydrant*[™] filter (which removes bacteria and viruses and lasts for more than 10 years, with minimal maintenance) was used in these projects and can provide enough clean, safe water for more than 350 families.

He then described a project in Colombia, South America where Disaster Aid is working with the RC of Bogotá Teusaquillo and District 4281 for a Rotary Foundation Grant to enable installation of *SkyHydrants* in 70 rural schools. David asked the current District Governors to consider supporting the proposal with funding of \$5,000 per District.

The presentation was well received, and during the next two days our information stand was kept very busy with requests for information, particularly on the *SkyHydrant* water filtration systems, and the many Disaster Aid safe water projects.

OUR ONGOING WORK IN THE PHILIPPINES

Rotarians, working with others to rebuild communities ... together.

The **Disaster Aid International** partnership with **The Balay Mindanaw Foundation** has already gone a long way: from *Typhoon Sendong (Washi)* in 2011, *Typhoon Pablo (Bopha)* in 2012, *Bohol* earthquake in 2013, and *Super Typhoon Yolanda (Haiyan)* in 2013 where we provided temporary shelters, family survival kits and Shelter Repair Kits (SRKs) to survivors and communities affected by disasters in Mindanao and Visayas.

Together, DAI, Balay Mindanaw and *SkyJuice Foundation* have also partnered with the objective that every child in the Philippines has access to safe drinking water. To date, DAI has donated 45 *SkyHydrants* to Balay Mindanaw and 24 have already been installed in 19 barangays (villages) in Mindanao and Visayas directly benefitting 6,700 families.

There is more to be done ... and it is ongoing.

DISASTER AID INTERNATIONAL – news and updates

- DAI 's Ecuador earthquake appeal still needs any assistance that can be provided.
- DAI Chairman David Langworthy, will be in Malaysia in October for the Disaster Aid Malaysia Conference: delegates to this event are self-funding (as *all* of David's are).
- David will then visit the Philippines for meetings with partner, *The Balay Mindanaw Foundation*, local Government and Rotary Clubs. One club in particular, the RC of West Cagayan De Oro has become increasingly involved with DAI and its work.
- A week after return, David goes to Chile, and then Colombia to meet with the Rotary Clubs in Bogotá behind the ¹Safe Water for Rural Schools Project. Then to Cartagena, Colombia to meet with another Rotary Club who has a water project, and then to Chapecó, Brazil to meet with Rotarians from all the Chapecó Rotary Clubs who want to set up Disaster Aid Brazil. Interestingly whilst in Chapecó they have arranged a meeting with the University in Chapecó to talk about Disaster Preparedness and Disaster Mitigation.
- From, Brazil he will go to Uruguay to meet with the RC of Plaza Matriz who is setting up Disaster Aid Uruguay. (David *then* hopes to have a couple of days off in Uruguay! – Ed.)

Nine clubs in D4281 in Bogotá are well advanced with an application for a Rotary Foundation Global Grant, thanks to mounting support of Rotarians around the world (for instance in Canada where the **RC of Montreal** has just added another \$2,500 to the pot).

DAI is to the fore in assisting with this project that will benefit "close to 10,000" in Colombia.
